# Application Instructions

If you are seeking admission to a Syracuse University undergraduate program as a part-time student, use this application packet. To apply for admission, you must have an admission interview with an academic advisor at University College, the continuing education division of Syracuse University. University College is the primary college for part-time students.

You may apply for single, dual, or combined enrollment.

- **Single enrollment** means having one major in one school and receiving one degree.

- **Dual enrollment** means having two different majors in two different schools but receiving a single degree granted by both schools.

- **Combined enrollment** also means having majors in two different schools but leads to two separate degrees conferred by both schools. Most combined enrollment programs require additional coursework.

Admission is reviewed on a continuing basis, so there is no application deadline for part-time undergraduates. Your application should be completed at least six weeks prior to the beginning of the semester.

For the purpose of this application, if you have attended any other institution of higher education on any basis for any period of time, you are considered a transfer student.

Also, if you've ever attended Syracuse University, including credit courses taken on a nonmatriculated basis through University College, please indicate this under "Previous Education" on your application. (Matriculation means admission to a degree program.)

## Here is a checklist of requirements to complete:

- Schedule an admission interview with a University College Academic Advisor. Please call 315-443-3261 to schedule your interview.
- Complete the enclosed two-page application form.

- Submit a typed, double-spaced personal statement describing past educational and work experience, present situation, and plans for the future.

- Audition/portfolio review (if required).

- Return the application form, your essay, and your \$70 nonrefundable application fee to Syracuse University/University College, 700 University Avenue, Academic Advising, Room 126, Syracuse, New York 13244-2530. Make check or money order payable to *Syracuse University*.

- In certain instances, the admission committee may request letters of recommendation from professors or employers after an initial review of your application.

- If you have not previously attended college, arrange to have an official GED certificate or an official copy of your high school transcripts and Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores (if you graduated from high school within the past five years) sent to Syracuse University/University College, Student Administrative Services, 700 University Avenue, Syracuse, NY 13244-2530.

- If you have attended college, arrange for an official copy of your transcripts of all previous undergraduate work to be sent directly to our office. Official transcripts must have a raised seal. Do not send photocopies. Transcripts should indicate years of attendance, subjects studied each year, and grades. A key to the grading system should also be included. All documents in languages other than English must be accompanied by a certified literal English translation.

- If your native language is other than English, you must take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).

If you are requesting that transcripts be sent ahead of your completed application, notify the Student Administrative Services office; we will hold your documents. We will acknowledge receipt of your application. When all the necessary transcript and other relevant materials (as noted above) have arrived, and you have completed your admission interview, we will review your application and notify you immediately when the decision is made.

**IMMUNIZATION RECORD (Persons born before January 1, 1957 are exempt.)**

Syracuse University and New York State require proof of immunity against measles, mumps, and rubella. If you previously submitted all proof and know you are in compliance, you do not need to submit proof again.

**Measles** Two doses of live measles vaccine (administered on or after January 1, 1968) received on or after 12 months of age and at least 30 days apart, OR physician diagnosis of disease (month, day, year), OR serologic evidence of immunity.

**Mumps** One dose of live mumps vaccine (administered on or after January 1, 1968) received at or after 12 months of age, OR physician diagnosis of disease (month, day, year), OR serologic evidence of immunity.

**Rubella** One dose of live rubella vaccine (administered on or after January 1, 1968) received at or after 12 months of age, OR serologic evidence of immunity. (Clinical diagnosis is not acceptable proof of immunity.)

OR

**Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR) Vaccine** Two doses of live measles vaccine (administered on or after January 1, 1968) received at or after 12 months of age and at least 30 days apart, OR serologic evidence of immunity.

AND

**Meningococcal Meningitis** The meningitis bill requires colleges to provide students with information on **MENINGOCOCCAL MENINGITIS**. This information has been mailed to all students. It is also available at <http://students.syr.edu/health>. **A RESPONSE FORM MUST BE FILED** with the health office indicating that the information has been reviewed and the student has either been immunized or has opted not to be immunized. The response form can be downloaded at <http://students.syr.edu/health/meningitis.html> and returned to the Health Center at 111 Waverly Ave.

**The bill prohibits students not fulfilling the requirements to remain enrolled. Failure to file this form with the Syracuse University Health Center may result in a hold on your registration.**
